- 13 global representatives
- Range of utilities, manufacturers, consultants and academics
- Survey of 17 international utilities as part of the technical brochure
- Started mid 2019, publishing TB this year

Appoint a secretary

Face to face meetings when possible

Collaboration (in smaller groups)





Convening a working group – Tips

Treat like a project

Develop a framework early on

Allocate responsibility

Send out a survey early on

Limit convener drafting responsibilities

Interim milestones e.g. conference papers





Convening a working group – Challenges

You're in it for the long haul

Scheduling meetings across a wide range of timezones

Varying levels of involvement from representatives

Consolidating various sections of a brochure written by different authors

Progress is not linear
